Headteacher's End of Year Message

It has been a fantastic year for St. Mary's. The children have been immersed in so many new and exciting learning opportunities which have inspired and challenged them. As a staff, we too have been excited and challenged as we strive to further develop our practice for the good of our children and wider school family. Read, Write, Inc. and Maths Makes Sense have been an incredible success in raising standards. Significantly more children than ever before are completing their Reception year with a 'Good Level of Development'. 81% compared with 57% last year! Our Year 1 children have achieved record results in their Phonics Screening with 83% achieving the pass mark compared with 69% last year! The success stories continue throughout the key stages including the Roseland Residential, The Lion King, Swimming Gala, Year 6 Parents' Meal, Porthpean Residential, Anti-Bullying Workshops, Prayer Space Week, Den Building Day, Graduation Ceremonies, not to mention the numerous class trips in and around the county to support and inspire learning....the list goes on!

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you, our parents. Without your continued support, we would be unable to serve our children in the way that we do. Building a positive home-school partnership is something we have worked hard to improve on this year and we will continue to do so from September. You are your child's first teacher and we value greatly the important part you play in your child's development.

A huge thanks to our Governing Body for their part in the many improvements in each corner of our school. Both their support and challenge has been invaluable to our children, staff and parents – and all of it voluntary. Some of these improvements you will be aware of, others may be less obvious to you. The procedures and systems in place to keep all children safe has been completely reviewed and changed to ensure Safeguarding remains our number one priority. The way in which we teach Reading, Writing and Mathematics has been transformed through quality first teaching.
