**FACT!** Languages improve job prospects. 71% of UK employers are dissatisfied with the foreign language skills of school and college leavers<sup>3</sup>.

**FACT!** Being proficient in another language makes it easier to study or work overseas. Funding to spend time abroad as part of any degree is often not taken up because students do not have language skills<sup>4</sup>.

**FACT!** Starting language learning early can enhance children's cognitive development<sup>5</sup>.
