Class Dojo

Please check Class Dojo on a daily basis, everything is communicated through the app to ensure parents have the information they need regarding day to day schooling.



Some pupils are regularly missing the chance to register and choose lunch with their friends resulting in them missing learning opportunities like 5 in 5 and Read, Write, Inc. Children feel embarrassed when they are late and the rest of the class is already settled into learning and it also has a negative impact on their learning and social opportunities. Please ensure your child arrives between 8.45-8.55am ready to learn.
